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Alasdair's Introduction

We've had a very busy year at Glen Oaks and we've faced new challenges while still working hard to provide an excellent service to our tenants.

Earlier this year we provided the Scottish Housing Regulator with our first Annual Assurance Statement. This is an important part of the Regulatory Framework introduced by the Regulator in February. We carried out a thorough self-assessment of our services and our Board was able to confidently state that Glen Oaks is complying with all regulatory requirements and standards. We also reviewed and updated our website earlier this year, to make sure the information on the website meets the requirements of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

Our Mission Statement is - 'Our aim is to provide good quality affordable housing and an excellent service. We will encourage resident participation and work with other agencies to regenerate our community' ... so how have we been doing in relation to that?

Well, first of all, we are totally committed to providing good quality affordable housing. One of the highlights of our year has been starting work on building 49 high-quality new homes in Arden. We're working in partnership with AS Homes (Scotland) Limited on this new development which was made possible thanks to investment funding from the Scottish Government and Glasgow City Council as well as private finance.

We continue to provide excellent service

and we are always looking at how we can do better. This is demonstrated by our Customer Service Excellence accreditation which we retained following our recent re-assessment. Our Service Improvement Group (SIG) also do an excellent job of scrutinising why we do things and how we do them, and make suggestions about how we could do them better. The independent reviews carried out by the SIG have already led to improvements to our service. They are currently looking at how we communicate with our residents - we'll report on their findings in future newsletters.

Glen Oaks has always encouraged our residents to participate in our work, whether that's joining our Board or Service Improvement Group, taking part in surveys, giving us your views on the rent you pay us, or even just by attending things like our Residents Event or the Fun Days. Every 3 years, we carry out a Tenant Satisfaction Survey which gives us the chance to ask what you think about the services we provide. This year, 97% of tenants were satisfied with the opportunities to participate in our work, and 90% were satisfied with the overall service provided by Glen Oaks.

Our popular goConnect and Starting Out projects support our local communities by offering our residents support with their tenancy and other issues. Both projects also run clubs and classes that can improve residents' mental and physical health, or help them to move into further education or improve their career



prospects. As you can see on page 6, the St. Andrew's Day Ceilidh, organised by the goConnect team, was a success again this year. It was great to see so many residents coming along to celebrate and learn about each other's traditions.

I'd like to thank our Board, Service Improvement Group and staff for their hard work and commitment to Glen Oaks during the past year.

And last, but not least, I'd like to wish every one of you a Merry Christmas and a very Happy New Year!

We are currently developing an online Housing Application Form that will be available on our website in early 2020.



We are also refreshing our Tenant Login area to have the same look and feel as our website which will go live together with the new online application process.

Rent Increase Consultation 2020-21

We have a legal duty to consult you about proposed rent increases, and to take account of your opinions before we make a final decision.

We have recently sent you a letter asking you for your views on our proposal this year. We have also offered the use of SurveyMonkey for those residents who have supplied e-mail addresses and noted that you can also leave us a response on our website - www.glenoaks.org.uk [please remember to do so before 18 December 2019].

As you may know, we are consulting this year on a 2.6% and a 2.8% increase.

- A 2.6% increase would allow us to deliver our mainstream services to you but would not allow us to offer you many of the classes and services provided by our goConnect project which has focussed on delivering numerous community activities in the last couple of years.
- A 2.8% increase would allow us to continue with some of the activities and classes that have been enjoyed

by you, like the craft classes, walking group, English language classes, and community events.

The Board will meet at the end of January 2020 to review your feedback in advance of approving the rent increase. We will inform you of the rent increase by letter during February and will also provide details of your feedback in our Spring newsletter.





Rent Restructure

Thank you to those tenants who took the opportunity to respond to our recent consultation on our proposed rent restructure. Our prize draw of £30 Silverburn vouchers was won by Mrs J. Fox of Arden.

From what you told us, the results showed:

- 78% agreed rent should vary by size of property
- 88% agreed rent should vary by type of property

Popularity of property types highlighted:

- 1. Detached house
- 2. 3 storey townhouses
- 3. Semidetached/ end terrace house
- 4. Mid terrace house
- 5. Four in a block
- 6. Main Door Flat
- 7. Tenement/flat

Feedback showed that there were varying views on what amenities tenants should be charged for:

- Driveway
- 59% agreed
- Private garden
- 41% agreed
- Additional WC/ shower room
- 39% agreed
- Kitchen type
- 23% agreed

OVERALL

- 89% agreed a rent system based on property size and type would be fair
- 81% agreed a rent system based on property size, property type and property elements would be fair

We will be writing to you early in the New Year, to explain the details of our new rent structure. The Association's Board have approved a new rent structure following your feedback. The reason for changing our rent structure is to create a fairer, more transparent rent charge.

You can pay your rent at a Post Office, at a PayPoint outlet, or online

Emergency Repairs

Our telephone system gives tenants the option to report emergency repairs when our office is closed by calling the usual office number 0141 638 0999 and choosing the option which transfers your call to Gas Sure (for gas and heating) or City Building (for all other repairs).

Alternatively, you can call the contractors directly on the following numbers:

These numbers should also be used when our offices are closed over the festive holidays. The Association's offices will close at **5pm** on **Monday 23 December 2019** and will re-open at **9am** on **Friday 3 January 2020**.

Christmas & New Year Holidays

We appreciate that people like to spend time with their family over the festive period. With this in mind, we would ask tenants who will be away from their home during the holidays to let us know when they will be away and give us details of an emergency contact, such as a friend in the local area. This is to ensure that in the event of any major problem (e.g. burst water pipes) we can deal with the problem swiftly and with the least disruption to all parties.

FREE home fire safety visit!

As part of their commitment to building a safer Scotland, the Scottish Fire & Rescue Service offer everyone in Scotland a free home fire safety visit. They can also fit smoke alarms free of charge if your home requires them. You can get in touch with the Scottish Fire & Rescue Service to arrange a home visit:

Don't forget to play your part too! By testing your smoke alarm monthly, you can rest assured that should a fire break out in your home, you may gain vital extra minutes, allowing you and your family more time to reach safety.

In the past 2 years, there have been 4 separate fires in Glen Oaks homes, some



having no functioning smoke alarm despite the Association fitting one in every home. Worryingly, the non-working alarms were thought to have been deactivated by someone in the household. **Never remove batteries or disconnect smoke alarms.**

Paying your rent over the festive period!

We all want to have as good a time as we can but not go into the New Year worrying about overspending or getting into debt.

It's important to safeguard the things that are important, for example by making sure you pay your rent on time. Your rent is due by 23 December 2019 (sorry about that!) and payments can be made by the following methods:

- Log on to Glen Oaks' website and follow the link for payments.
- · Pay at the Post Office or a local PayPoint.
- Call Allpay on 0844 5578321 (closed 25 & 26, 28 & 29
 December and 1 January) between 9am and 5.30pm, except
 Christmas Eve when closing time is 4pm.
- Payments can also be taken by contacting our office on 0141 638 0999 to pay by debit or credit card before 19 December 2019.

If you are having difficulty paying your rent, you should contact us as soon as possible so that advice and assistance can be given before any major problems can develop. Your Housing Services Officer can help and can also refer you to other agencies that offer free advice on debt and budgeting. There is a Welfare Rights Officer available in the office to help with benefit advice and applications.



If you get part of your rent paid by Housing Benefit you might be entitled to a further 'top up' of anything between £5 to £25 per week of Discretionary Benefit and this is something the Welfare Rights Officer can apply for on your behalf.

Please be aware that if you are paying by credit or debit card or paying by cash in the Post Office or other payment kiosks, there is a delay between you making the payment and the payment being credited to your rent account. To avoid your rent being credited late, please make sure payments are made before Thursday 19 December 2019.

Anti-social behaviour is unacceptable

We believe that all tenants and residents have a right to live peacefully in their homes and as such we take antisocial behaviour which adversely affects that right very seriously.

Glen Oaks Housing Association works very closely with Glasgow City Council's Neighbourhoods and Sustainability Service to ensure that anti-social behaviour is dealt with appropriately. This partnership working allows us to access a wide range of services and support.

Please report **all incidences** of anti-social behaviour to us, or call Police Scotland directly on 101. It is important that this behaviour is recorded as we may need to instigate legal action against the perpetrators which means that we need to present evidence of their behaviour. Repeat offending could put their tenancy at risk.

During the festive period, we often see increased incidences of anti-social behaviour as people celebrate. Please be mindful of your neighbours and show consideration for others during the season of goodwill.

AS Homes recently invited pupils in P7 at Ashpark Primary School and children from the Jimmy Dunnachie Nursery to visit the new build site in Arden and learn more about construction of houses. The contractor showed the children the same house type at 3 different stages in the building process from foundations to nearly completed internally.

Everyone found the visit very interesting with a lot of great questions asked by several of the visitors challenging the staff on site. The children also learned a lot of the Health & Safety risks of working on and visiting a construction site and what safety measures are required to protect everyone on a construction site.

The visit was arranged as part of Glen Oaks and AS Homes community benefit programme resulting from the new build contract.



Tree planting at Ashpark Primary

We were recently approached by one of the teachers at Ashpark Primary School asking if we could help them out with any aspect of Outdoor Learning. We were delighted to get involved in a tree planting project with P4 pupils at the end of November. A group of Glen Oaks staff went along to the school to help the children plant a selection of trees supplied by the Woodland Trust.

Bin Collections

Glasgow City Council's Cleansing Department has provided the following details for bin collections over the Christmas and New Year period.

Main door properties:

- Bins due for collection on 25 December 2019 (Christmas Day) will be collected on Friday 27 December 2019
- Bins due for collection on 26 December 2019 (Boxing Day) will be collected on Saturday 28 December 2019
- Bins due for collection on 1 January 2020 (New Year's Day) will be collected on Friday 3 January 2020
- Bins due for collection on 2 January 2020 will be collected on Saturday 4 January 2020

Tenement properties:

 Bins due for collection from tenement properties on Christmas Day and New Year's Day will have their bin collection on an alternative date. Glasgow City Council has advised that bins will be collected weekly during the festive period, however they are unable to give us a specific day for collection.

Festive We wish your a safe and happy Christmas Home Safety



Thieves know that over Christmas there will be high value presents and maybe more cash in your house than normal. Keep your home secure - lock all windows and doors, don't leave gifts in view of the windows and keep cash in your home to a minimum.



If you're going away for Christmas, keep your home secure. Lock all windows and doors, set your house alarm if you have one, use timers on lights, cancel any deliveries and ask a neighbour or friend you trust to keep an eye out while you're away.



If you're having a house party with lots of guests, it can be all too easy for a thief to slip in unnoticed. Make sure you know everyone who is there. If you're going to a party, don't let anyone tailgate you into a house or through a secured communal entry door who may not be a guest.



Protect any gifts you've bought for your friends and family. Get them to register mobile phones, tablets, laptops and cameras at www.immobilise.com. Don't give them a good quality bike without giving them a good quality lock, and register bikes at www.BikeRegister.com.
